After climbing, some of the group went to a Howard Johnson Resturant for supper and then to a movie afterward.



Ye Olde Thrills and Chills Stock Company convened again for filming purposes, this time at the scene of an earlier thriller. The Hollywood Climb once again has demonstrated its photogenic characteristics.

Following the usual late breakfast at the leanto Saturday morning, the group trudged to the top, along with the spectators, cinematographer and directors. In anticipation of a fall on the Hollywood Climb crossover, Johnnie Reed went up and labored with a star drill for fifteen minutes or so to put in a strategic expansion bolt, but alas, after drilling the hole, Johnnie put in the sleeve backwards - and couldn't extract it. Undaunted by this setback, the actors roped up, with the camera grinding away, and proceeded up to the second ledge in an unusually hazardous appearing manner. Earl led, with Jane seconding and Tommy Marshall bringing up the rear. This morning the telephone rang with disagreeable insistance. It was your harrassed Editor Gerry Morgan wanting to know why my copy for the May 10, 1953 activities had not been submitted. The events of the day went somewhat like this: On the lower section of Socrates' Downfall it was up! DOWN! up! DOWN! making very good belay practice. On the middle section of the Downfall, Reynolds reinacted Socrates taking the Hemlock (tree). For the CowHoof portion of the route Lane truly gave a most graceful and sprightly demonstration of how it should be done. After rappels and bowline-on-the-bite descents for those who wanted them. the crowd departed in installments for the Pot Holes where the personnel drove pitons, made climbs, did Bulgarie rescues, Prussic Knot ascents and descents until they ran out of steam. For the Bulgarie rescues Donna and Jim Willard worked the ropes with perfect coordination and had the rescued individuals out of the crevasses (up the rock face) literally "on the run". The Prussic Knot ascents and descents for those who tried them might be summarized as a lot of "fun and frustration". One person came down so fast it was alarming, while another came down so slow it was alarming. All told it was a very adopt crew and did everything gracefully for fun that the experts were making such a spectacle trying to do out at Old Rag that same day for the movie camera.
