FALL SCHEDULE

- 4. Nov. Carderock, Md. Belay practice with "Oscar". (Novices: don't miss this trip).
- 10-11-12 Nov. Wolf Gap Shelter, Climb Saturday at Devils Garden, Sunday on Big Schloss and Monday explore Ice Mountain, West Virginia. Commissary by car. Bring tents. Leader: Jame Showacre.

Directions to Wolf Gap Shelter: U.S. 211 to Gainesville, Virginia 55 to Strasburg, U.S. 11 to traffic light in Woodstock (zero point). Continue 1.1 miles further south and turn right on Virginia 42. At 2.9 miles take right fork. At 8.9 miles take left fork, at 9.6 miles take right fork. Wolf Gap is 13 miles from Woodstock. The shelter is the south side near the road. 108 miles fm D.C. Devils Garden: Take Trout Run Road from Wardensville south about 5 miles. Leave car at small stream crossing. Turn right downstream along small stream a short distance to Trout Run. Cross Trout Run and proceed upstream. Rocks are to right about Trout Run. Head for the rocks or go upstream a short distance to low place on ridge. (Wardensville Quadrangle).

Big Schloss: Go north along trail across the road from the shelter approx. 2 miles to the rocks.

Ice Mountain: From Wardensville take Va. 259 to U.S. 50. Turn left on U.S. 50 to Capon Bridge. Cross bridge and turn right (towards Slanesville) on macadem road, to Northriver Mills (approx. 8 miles from highway, store and post office). Cross concrete bridge and continue right to too of ridge. Turn right to Ice Mountain (signs on trees at this intersection). Park near deserted house. Follow trail to right along stream and up hill to cliffs.
