## Baby, it's coooold outside; Ice climbing trips on the way

The Mountaineering Section has three ice-climbing trips scheduled for January and February: The first trip is set for the long weekend honoring Rev. Martin Luther King's birthday, Jan. 18-20, 1997. The second and third trips are set for February; one during the Feb. 1-2 weekend, and another over the President's Day long weekend, Feb. 15-17.

Also, hard-core ice man Bill Summers is looking for experienced ice climbers for several trips this season.

The best options for beginning ice climbers would be to schedule a weekend lesson over the long weekends in either January or February. Space is limited, so make your plans today to join in the fun.

## January trip to Adirondacks

The pre-Fall arrival of the Winter Black Diamond catalog signaled the starte of the 1996-97 ice climbing season. Looking at the new toys and the pictures of climbs I would never be able to do told me that it was time to start planning this winter's acitivities.

For the last five years MS member Anne Baron has done a great job of organizing an ice trip to the Adirondacks over the three-day Martin Luther King holdiay. On these trips we always stayed at Ed Pallin's Rock and River Lodge, but this year there will have to be a change in plans. The Mountaineer Shop and the Rock and River have planned the first ever Adirondack International Mountaineering Festival over that weekend (Jan. 17-19, 1997) and are using all of Ed's facilities for the out-of-town instructors and company representatives.

For those of you who want to keep the January tradition alive and perhaps participate in the festival, I have located alternate accomodations. We have reserved a cottage at the White Sled Motel; it accomodates 8-10 people and has a kitchen. The cost for three nights' lodging will be \$45 per person if 10 people sign up and \$55 per person if eight sign up. ## Winters with Summers Wanted: experienced ice climbers

Experienced ice climbers looking for some extended, cold-weather camping and climbing should consider hooking up with Bill Summers. Right now he has two trips planned and is looking for partners who have gear, experience and enthusiasm.

Interested climbers can call Bill at: (703) 631-1682 (home) or leave a message at (800) 945-2710 and he'll callback.

Here's what Bill has planned:

Trip 1—Dec. 12-16—Adirondacks: Thursday, Dec. 12, leave in the afternoon and return Monday, Dec. 16—Do a lot of quick ice bagging, routes tend to be thin, snow normally isn't very deep, which reveals excellent short problems. This is the time to work on that ice climbing technique we all need. Also, no crowds.

Trip 2—Dec. 27-31—Smuggler's Trip Same information as the Adirondacks trip. Must have your own bivy and climbing gear.

Expect deep snow, very hard approaches, harsh winter conditions, hard, brittle ice, and great ice climbing. I plan to build a snow cave. The conditions here make it worth the effort.

Good long routes, nice ski in and out. Friday, Dec. 27: Leave in the afternoon to drive up. Bivy in Smuggler's parking lot that night.

Saturday, Dec. 28: Get an early start, ski in, set up bivy, climb in the afternoon.

Sunday & Monday, Dec. 29-30: Climb, bivy.

Tuesday, Dec. 31: New Year's Eve, climb in the morning and do a late

evening climb route on Mt. Mansfield side of the Notch. Top out at night to bring in the new year. The view is tremendous.

Trip 3—MLK weekend—Adirondacks: During the January club trip to the Adirondacks, I plan to go up early and spend most of the time bivvied at the North Face of Pitchoff.

Anyone who would like to go along and bivy should have their own gear. Climbing gear the same. I'll have one rope and multi-pitch lead gear there. If someone wants to ski back for a day of climbing, come back to the pond and shout my name several times. If two or more people come in, bring one rope per person. All climbing will be lead, multi-pitch.

This is a good opportunity to get cold weather camping experience. If you want to do some long climbs, in winter conditions, this is a great place. Bring a good headlamp and plenty of batteries.

Gear check lists are available if you would like one.

Trip 3 itinerary—Jan. 15-21

Wednesday, Jan. 15: Leave early afternoon and drive up. Bivy in the parking lot for Roaring Brook Falls.

Thursday, Jan. 16: Climb Chapel Pond area in the morning, afternoon ski into the North Face of Pitchoff and set up bivy.

Friday, Jan. 17 & Saturday, Jan. 18: Climb, bivy.

Sunday, Jan. 19: Climb in the morning, afternoon ski out. Bivy in the parking lot or in a campsite at the cross-country ski trail going into Mt. Marcy. (Lefthand turn before Loj, drive to end of road.)

can be trip reports, book reviews, gear reviews, good beta for climbs, red points, etc. Articles can be submitted to Up Rope either via the Internet or on a diskette in plain ASCII format (PC or Mac). We also accept photos (and return them!). Monday, Jan. 20: Get an early start, drive to Pok-o-Moonshine and climb. Bivy in the parking loat at Roaring Brook Falls.

Tuesday, Jan. 21: Climb Mineville Pillar, leave by 11:00 a.m. to drive back.

Other trips—White Oak, Riegelsville, Katahdin.

White Oak Canyon trips will start in early January and go into February. This is an excellent place for beginners and a good place to work on your technique. Bring a head lamp and batteries.

Riegelsville ice also starts in early January and goes until late February. Weekends tend to become crowded. Weekdays are the safest.

Katahdin trip: Looking for at least three experienced climbers with coldweather camping experience for a possible trip in late February. Excellent chance to do some five-plus-pitch climbs. Speed and efficiency get put to the real test. This team would need to be a good mix of leaders and seconds. A total of six climbers would be an ideal number. There are lots of forms to fill out and mail in, so we'll need to get the group together quickly.

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
